Callum Booker, an Advanced Practice Apprentice said: I was happy to talk to MHA about my experience as an apprentice for Rolls-Royce. I enjoyed filming content as it helped build my confidence and I hope people find my answers engaging.

The videos created in association with Rolls-Royce will give residents and members an insight into the World of work today and how things may have changed over the years; specifically over the course of the pandemic.

Our Digital Communities team will be teaming up with a multitude of businesses across varied sectors to provide insight into the working World for our residents and members to engage with. 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Crafts from around the World to our communities

Our Digital Communities team have been working closely with an Artist and Teacher, Katie Sandoval, to create videos on how to make some crafts. Katie has been teaching art for around 14 years and has a studio based in Nottingham.

Her art has always been something she likes to experiment with textures and colours. One of the things Katie did during the Covid-19 Lockdowns was ask her friends from around the World to send her photos of places where they were going for walks which, in turn, really inspired her to create art based on landscapes.

Katie also describes flowers as one of her favourite things to create:

A lot of the work I do is really inspired by just looking out of the window and pottering around in my own garden. I love to grow flowers and I love to paint them.







Katie grew up in Mexico City as a child before relocating to the UK which has inspired her work through all of her life. She dives into showcasing some Mexican art forms in the videos that the Digital Communities team have created.

The videos focus on how to make a Mexican Fan and how to craft an Ojo De Dios which is also known as an Eye of God. These are colourful woven decorations and are hung around the home; these are often referred to as a 'lucky charm'.

These videos will be available to watch by our members and residents so they can get creative and have a go at making their own.

Promoting creativity is key throughout our services as it allows members and residents to not only try something new they haven't before but also encourages contentment and calm.

Our Digital Communities aim to prevent isolation and loneliness in older people by using videos to promote social inclusion and feeling sense of belonging.

Engaging creatively through chaplaincy

Yvonne Myers, one of our chaplains based at Amathea has created a Dementia Bible.

After speaking to Yvonne she explained: "It took two years to create and there have been further modifications in the last year as I gathered more feedback from residents using it.

"I was inspired to create the Dementia Bible after I saw many residents who for reasons of eyesight, loss of cognitive ability and dementia, were not able to access the scriptures of the Bible that had often sustained them through their journey.

"And so, I attempted to create a Bible that was easier to understand and I asked my residents (including a range of residents and not only those living with dementia) to tell me what they wanted.

"I was most moved by my Care Home Manager, Debbie Studholme, who is not a person of faith but who loved the idea of the Dementia Bible. She took it home to look at and the next day she told me she had been so engaged in it that she had read the whole thing in a night. I was really touched that she would take the time to do that."

Yvonne identified key scriptures in the Bible and made them easier to read and understand by enlarging and simplifying the words. What a wonderful initiative by Chaplain, Yvonne.



Knitting new friendships in Retirement Living

Our Activity Coordinator, Yasmin, who works at MHA Moor Allerton in Leeds, talks about how creativity can help build friendships and how it can help others.

Yasmin said: "We set up a knit and natter group several months ago which has become increasingly popular!

"During these sessions the group knitted many squares and one of the residents, June, sewed them together and knitted edges onto the blankets. Together these ladies have made 15 blankets. Upon completion, this magnificent group of residents made a fantastic decision as to what to do with the blankets."



June, the 'head knitter' said: We have made the decision to donate these blankets to the families in the Ukraine because they need them at this devastating time more than we do.

What a wonderful way to turn something that is a bit of fun into something that really has an impact. We admire these ladies and the work that they have done to help those in need.



Interview with MHA Communities Winchester member, Sylvia Jobling

We asked what MHA means to Sylvia and how she'd like to give something back to help generations to come.

How did you come to hear about the MHA Communities scheme in Winchester?

In 2013 I injured my back quite badly and I was in hospital for three weeks, I ended up having a lot of therapy and I didn't think I would ever walk again.

To help with my recovery, my doctor directed me to the exercise classes that were run by my local MHA Communities scheme.

From there I went on to join their singing group and joining them on their days out, it's just gone on from there.



good job, especially helping those who are isolated or lonely.

How have you benefited from joining the scheme?

I've met new friends, I met my partner Harry, I have a wonderful relationship with him, I've found love. I also have made friendships with many others.

I've also developed quite an interest in the welfare of 'older citizens' and become much more politically aware of issues affecting older people.

What would you say to people who are thinking about joining a local scheme?

I would say join, and I often speak to people on a bus and I tell them, and I speak to my children, they all know. My children even say, when they're older they'll volunteer and join.

I know that you have kindly chosen to leave a gift in your Will to MHA, why did you decide to remember us in this special way?

I think MHA do such a jolly good job, especially helping those who are isolated or lonely, MHA do a really good job in reaching those people. And giving MHA a bit of money would be a good thing to carry out that mission.

How did you find the process of leaving a gift in your Will to us, was it straightforward?

Oh yes, I had already made a Will and I then just updated it through a solicitor. It was really easy.

What one piece of advice would you pass on to future generations?

To younger people I'd say, remember that one day you'll be old.

You could be like me and 88 and still able to walk and talk but you

might not be, you might have dementia or something that stops you getting out and about.

The thought of not being able to get out of a chair will make you laugh when you're younger, but it's something that we all really think about when you are older.

A warm thank you!

We are extremely grateful to The Wolfson Foundation whom have granted us £45,000 towards an exciting new project. 'Learning for Life' is an intergenerational project that will see young adults produce exciting new content for MHA Digital Communities.

A huge thank you goes to The National Lottery Community Fund for their ongoing support, most recently supporting MHA Communities Kent with a £9,800 donation that will enable young people from local schools to help support activity sessions alongside staff and volunteers. Members will learn new technology skills, internet safety and improve their confidence online to help build a more resilient and connected community. MHA Communities Wakefield secured £90,000 funding over 2 years from Nova Wakefield to work with other partners in delivering a support service for older people discharged from hospital.

Working together, MHA North and South Staffordshire Communities schemes, have successfully bid for £50,000 from Support Staffordshire as part of the Captain Tom initiative aimed at reducing isolation and loneliness in the elderly population.

Through The Health Tree Foundation, MHA has received £20,000 for MHA Communities Hull & East Riding to run a programme of green care activities focused on growing vegetables and the benefits of healthy eating.

Thank you to all Trusts & Foundations for their incredible acts of generosity. This has enabled us to continue providing support to people in later throughout local communities all over Britain.
